My parents, at the height of the Depression, were forced to go on home relief, which is known as welfare today. It was 1935, when I was 10 years old, and we lived on the first floor of a walk-up apartment on 43rd Street, in Brooklyn, New York.

A few days before Christmas, I looked out a kitchen window to see my father sitting on the stoop, dejected and depressed, with tears in his eyes. The mailman was approaching our building and asked my father what was wrong.

I heard my father say that he had used up his food vouchers and that the rent was past due. He had tried to work as a laborer through the Works Progress Administration, but he wasn't a very strong man, and the work had been too hard for him. I was scared, having seen newspaper pictures of people being put out on the street with all their belongings.

"Ike, how much do you need?" the mailman asked. My dad said he needed \$33 for the rent, and without hesitation, the mailman took \$50 from his wallet and handed it to my father.

My dad said, "I don't know when I'll be able to pay you back." The mailman put an arm around my father and said it would be okay if he paid him back or he didn't pay him back.

The mailman noticed me looking through the window and said, "Isaac, things will not be this way forever. If you or your son will remember this day, there will be times in the future when someone needs your help. Help them within your means and tell them what happened this day. This will be my payback. Merry Christmas and Happy Chanukah."

Hyrum City Christmas Celebration - Please join us on Saturday, December 2nd from 12:00 to 2:00 p.m. at the historic Elite Hall for the Hyrum City Christmas Celebration! We are excited to host the celebration at the Elite Hall this year where Santa will visit with children while we enjoy hot chocolate and cookies. We invite citizens to provide decorated Christmas trees for display in a community tree festival and contest. To compliment the trees, we also invite the public to bring gingerbread houses for display at the celebration.



First, second, and third place tree & gingerbread house entries will receive a \$200, \$100, and \$50 credit to their utility account. Voting will be by the public from 12:00 to 1:45 p.m. when votes will be tallied, and the winners announced at the end of the celebration. Winter Parking Restrictions - Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way, unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists for a period longer than fifteen minutes when loading or unloading or delivering property between the hours of 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect until April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Indoor Walking - As the weather turns colder, don't forget that the Elite Hall is open Monday - Friday from 7:00 - 10:00 a.m. for free public walking. All are welcome, but please supervise children and don't bring any food or drinks other than water.

Museum News - Did you know that the first metal detectors were invented in the late 1800s to help locate bullets in injured patients? Inventors also recognized the value of finding pockets of metal underground to aid mining operations, so developed many types of portable and industrial metal detectors throughout the last century.
