Municipal General Election - The 2023 Municipal General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 21, 2023. Ballots will be mailed out to registered voters, beginning October 31. To receive a ballot, voters must be of legal voting age, citizens of the United States, and reside in the City in which they are registered. Voters can verify registration status at https://vote.utah.gov/. Registered voters who do not receive a ballot or anyone with questions about their ballot should contact the Cache County Clerk's Office at www.CacheCounty.org/Elections or call the Cache County Clerk's Office at 435-755-1460.

Ballots can be returned by mail (postage is paid) or in person at the Cache County Clerk's Office 179 N Main (inside during regular business hours) or outside 24/7 at this location. Ballots can also be returned in person at Hyrum City Offices Ballot Drop Box 60 West Main before 8:00 p.m. on November 21, 2023.
