Using Utah's Public Meeting Notice Website

Did you know that Cache County and our partner agencies hold public meetings every week. Those meetings range from council meetings, to planning commission, and meetings about open space, county finances, public health and other programs.

Get Notified

The state's Open and Public Meetings Act requires government agencies to post agendas to notify the public in advance about meetings, when and where they will be held and what will be discussed at those meetings. Visit Utah.gov/pmn to see those agendas.

Subscribe for Updates

On the public meeting site, you can choose which agencies or public bodies you're interested in following and subscribe to receive updates. You'll get an email whenever an agenda is posted or changed.

Agendas, Minutes & Recordings


In addition to agendas of the meetings, you can access minutes to get a summary of past meetings and even find links to audio and video recordings of meetings you might have missed.
