Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Museum News – Did you know that just over 100 years ago, Hyrum's citizens found ways to celebrate and express gratitude as they grappled with the emergence of a major pandemic? The South Cache Courier reported that, "As the 1917 holiday season descended upon the city, the Hyrum branch of the Red Cross, recently organized, appointed members to committees that included membership, finance, publicity, supplies and public speaking. Then they, and all Hyrum residents, observed Red Cross Sunday. On Christmas Day, children gathered at Elite Hall where they decorated a Christmas tree, received a package of candy and nuts and then danced all afternoon. Christmas night, the city's adults danced to music furnished by the Silver Players." Isn't that a lovely picture? Today, as we navigate the issues regarding the current pandemic, we anticipate that the museum will remain open and able to serve our community. Through the end of 2020, museum hours will be Tuesday through Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. each day AND by appointment. We hope to expand hours in 2021---keep your fingers crossed!
