Mayors Message – After a night of strong winds, it was hard to believe the damage we saw throughout our community the morning of September 8th. It was heartbreaking to see more than 30 of the historic trees uprooted and laying on their sides in our beautiful cemetery. More than 20 trees at East Park were lost as well as many trees throughout the city. Power poles were broken and power lines were tangled in tree branches and laying across roads and properties. It was overwhelming as we assessed the damage and made plans to begin the long process of restoring power and cleaning up the trees & debris.

My heart took courage as our city employees went right to work without being told what to do. Employees for our Parks, Water, Roads & Sewer Departments busied themselves with clean-up efforts. We had volunteers helping from our Fire Department, UDOT, Cache County, Boy Scouts, and Nibley City. Local construction companies offered their help. Nucor Steel volunteered to replace & plant new trees at East Park. Our electrical superintendent, Matt Draper, made phone calls during the night, knowing we were going to need the extra help. Our lineman were fortunate to receive help from a crew of lineman from Brigham City, as well as Hunt Electric from the Salt Lake area. Together all worked more than 40 hours without sleep to restore as much power as possible. When it was suggested to them to take turns to sleep, their response was they were not going to quit until power was restored. That is an example of the dedicated employees we have here in Hyrum City. What I thought would take several months to clean-up was mostly completed 3 days later.

As I drove through town the next week and saw you wonderful citizens walking the streets with chainsaws, loading trailers full of limbs, and helping each other, my heart was full of gratitude! We all came together during another memorable event of 2020 and took care of each other. What a wonderful community we live in. I am grateful for each of you!!

Winter Parking Restrictions – Winter parking restrictions begin November 1st. Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb

exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.
