Mayors Message – Ambulance service is changing in the north & south regions of the county. In October of 2019, Logan City gave their 12-month notice that they were leaving CCEMS (Cache County Emergency Medical Services) to solely provide services to their residents. At that time all of the county was served by CCEMS under a license held by the county. The current license would be dissolved when Logan left. Decisions had to be made on how the rest of the county was going to provide necessary medical &

ambulance services. After many meetings, the county agreed to apply for a license to provide those services. Logan City was willing to provide those services at a substantially higher amount than we thought was reasonable. Under the new CCEMS contract approved by our City Council with the county, we were able to provide an excellent level of service through the county for \$15 per capita. Beginning in January 2021, each household, which averages to be 3.3 people, will be charged a rate to be determined by the City Council before the end of the year. Calculations show it will be somewhere in the \$4 to \$5 range a month with a 3% yearly increase. Hyrum's EMTs will continue to provide the quality first responder services as they have done so well in the past. The ambulance will continue to be housed in the current county building by the East Park, with back up ambulances in Wellsville & Mendon. I express appreciation to the County for the feasibility study they funded and for their commitment to assure our residents will have affordable, reliable ambulance service.
