Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Indoor Walking - The Elite Hall is open Monday thru Friday mornings from 7:00 to 11:00 a.m. for public walking. However, due to Jazz Nights at Elite Hall, it will not be open on Thursday, February 14th and Friday, February 15th.

Dog Licenses – Any dog(s) four (4) months or older is required to be licensed with Hyrum City. Dogs are required to be licensed even if they stay inside your home or never leave your yard. The license fees are as follows:

Neutered/Spayed dogs - \$12

Male/Female dogs - \$22

A veterinarian certificate is required to verify rabies vaccination and the dog being neutered or spayed. All dogs must be licensed by Thursday, February 28th. After February 28th a \$5 late fee will be assessed in addition to the regular license fee. Owners will be issued a citation for

failure to have his/her dog properly licensed. Also, please remember that City Ordinance permits a maximum of **two dogs per household**.

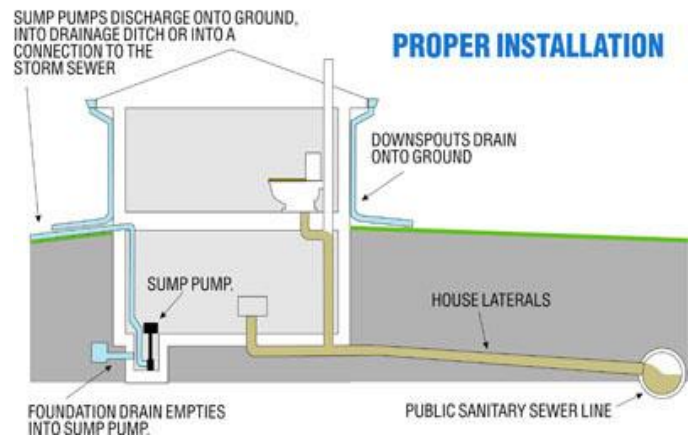
Sump Pumps - IS YOUR SUMP PUMP CONNECTED TO THE CITY'S SEWER SYSTEM??

Hyrum City prohibits sumps pumps from being connected to the City's Sewer System.

A violation of this ordinance is punishable by a fine of \$750.00 per day.

Sump pumps being discharged into Hyrum City's sewer system can result in operating at maximum capacity. With already high snow totals and the ground is already saturated with water the City wants to be prepared for the spring run-off. We need your help to eliminate sump pump water from being discharged into the City's sewer system in order

to prevent sewage back-up into your home and others around you. If you have questions or concerns about your sump pump or a neighbors draining into the City's sewer system please contact the City Offices at 435-245-6033.
