Mayors Message – The City Council is the legislative branch of municipal government and is comprised of five members, all of whom are elected at large. The Council is responsible to evaluate and pass ordinances, approve the budget, and consider other items that come before them during council meetings. The Mayor assigns them to plan and carry out events and to participate in various committees.

Steve Adams is the city representative for Home Owners Associations, oversees the Tree City USA Program. Is in charge of the Night Out Against Crime, and Hyrum's July 4th Parade.

Kathy Bingham works with the Hyrum City Youth Council, is a school liaison, and is in charge of the City Royalty Pageant, float and parades. She is also responsible for the watermelon for the 4th of July Celebration and organizes the Hyrum City Ski Night.

Jared Clawson is our irrigation representative, serves as a representative on the library board, is in charge of Hyrum City's Easter Egg Hunt, and oversees the booths on the city square on the 4^{th} of July.

Paul James oversees the City Recreation program, is our representative on the Senior Center Board, oversees the Hyrum Star Spangled Celebration, serves on the Cache County Mosquito Abatement Committee and is also the city webmaster.

Craig Rasmussen serves as our representative on the Museum Board, is the city's business representative, as well as an irrigation representative. He is also in charge of the community booth at the Cache County Fair and organizes the Holiday at Hardware.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.
