Hyrum benefitted from this program in many ways including the beautiful rockwork on the south side of Main Street from 300 East to 200 East and 100 West to 200 West. 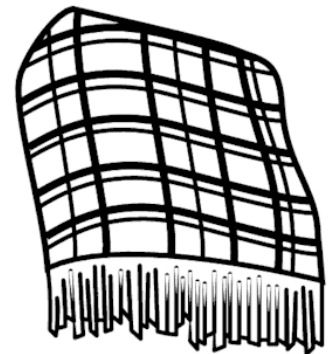
