City Council Meeting Summary - *The 2016-17 audit report was presented and accepted by the City Council.

* Building permits requested before improvements are completed in Phase 2 of Little Bear Creek Subdivision located at 225 North 600 West were approved with conditions: that the developer takes care of snow removal within the development; track mats must be added to prevent mud from being brought out onto city streets; and that each lot owner sign a letter recognizing the city is not liable and that there will be no occupancy permits given until improvements are completed.

* Resolution 17-18 was passed which accepted a petition for annexation of 238.64 acres south of Hyrum.

* Resolution 17-19 was approved which amended the Hyrum City Building Permit Inspection and Connection Fee Schedule.

* Resolution 17-20 was approved which amended the Hyrum City Emergency Operation Plan.

* Lisa Thomas was appointed to the Hyrum Library Board.

* Award of bid for the leasing of Richmond Irrigation Shares owned by Hyrum City was given.

* Award of bid for the contracting of Hyrum City's Cemetery landscaping and lawn care maintenance was given.

The information for this newsletter is required a month in advance. Therefore the January City Council Meeting has not taken place at the time this summary is composed.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Dog Licenses – Any dog(s) four (4) months or older is required to be licensed with Hyrum City. Dogs are required to be licensed even if they stay inside your home or never leave your yard. The license fees are as follows: Neutered/Spayed dogs - \$12 Male/Female dogs - \$22

A veterinarian certificate is required to verify rabies vaccination and the dog being neutered or spayed. All dogs must be licensed by Wednesday, February 28th. After February 28th a \$20 late fee will be assessed in addition to the regular license fee. Owners will be issued a citation for failure to have his/her dog properly licensed. Also, please remember that City Ordinance permits a maximum of **two dogs per household**.
