Mayors Message – The Hyrum City Youth Council is a wonderful group of youth between 9th – 12th grades that are learning about their local government through active participation. In 2017 there were over 2,500 hours of service to our community given by 43 youth and 5 advisors. They help with our city celebrations, library, museum, senior center, schools and more. All of the money they earn from sales at the candy cabin, July 4th dunking booth and teen dance is donated to something or someone in need in the community. I am so grateful for their service. They are great examples of good citizenship in our community.

We've been working on several projects in the city: demolition of the old city office building, building a new fire station, and the Hyrum City entrance sign on the west end of the city. We haven't determined at this time what we will do with the space where the old office building once stood. We have saved money until we finally have enough to build a new fire station, something we have needed and hoped to do for many years. The entrance sign as you come into the west entrance of Hyrum will be located west of Tim's Diesel. It will look like the sign that is at the north entrance of the city, including a statue of an elk.

City Council Meeting Summary - *Oath of office was given to newly elected Mayor, Stephanie Miller, Councilmember Paul James, Councilmember Jared Clawson & Councilmember Steve Adams.

* A public hearing was held to provide citizens with pertinent information about the Community Development Block Grant program and to allow for discussion of possible applications.

* Council approval was given to amend the final plat of Woodcrest Townhouses for lot line adjustments to allow individual ownership of townhomes at 328 East 100 North.

* Friend Weller reported on Hyrum City's transfer of low power FM radio license.

* Preliminary plat approval was given with conditions for Phase 1 of the Cache Ridge Subdivision consisting of 17 residential single-family building lots at approximately 530 North 600 East.

* Site plan approval was given for ON Automotive Repair and Retail Sales of used cars and car parts at 215 South Hammer Road.

- * City Council declined taking over snow removal and other road services in Blacksmith Fork Villas.
- * Valerie Plowman of Wellsville was approved to serve on the Hyrum Library Board.
- * Brian Carver was reappointed to serve another term on the Hyrum Planning Commission.
- * Resolution 18-02 was approved accepting a petition for annexation of certain real property. (Southeast Annexation – Wilkinson's Rosehill Dairy, JN Farms, Clawson, Nielsen, Harrison, Nielsen, Petersen, and Evans – 239.31 acres.)
- * Certification was approved of the Southeast Annexation Petition.
- * Phase 3 of Rolling Hills Subdivision was accepted.
- * Location of the new fire station was discussed.
- * Resolution 18-01 was approved authorizing Councilmember Craig Rasmussen to automatically succeed to the position of Mayor Pro Tempore.
- * Resolution 18-03 was approved adopting Hyrum City's Water Management and Conservation Plan.
- * Approval was given to the Utah Department of Transportation for a noise permit for a project of Highway 101 between Highway 165 and Hardware Ranch.

The information for this newsletter is required a month in advance. Therefore the January City Council Meeting has not taken place at the time this summary is composed.

Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.
