Mayors Message – Recently, I invited the state emergency management department to meet with our elected & appointed officials and public works supervisors for emergency training. During the three hour class we learned about possible incidents, how best to respond to them, and what help is available through the county, state and federal government. Our city council recently approved an updated city emergency plan. I appreciate Blake Christensen for his help in this endeavor.

I encourage residents with special needs, disabilities, access and functional needs to register with the Utah Special Needs Registry. You register by dialing 211. Relay users can call 888-826-9790. By registering, residents with special needs can provide emergency response agencies information so they can better serve them in a disaster or other emergency. Information given will not be available to the public.

Power outages are something you will experience occasionally. Hyrum City is continually upgrading our electrical infrastructure. In fact, we recently were recognized for having the most upgraded system in 2017. After all we can do to provide reliable electrical service, there is still things out of our control that happens. The main transmission lines feed our system occasionally have problems. Birds landing on our lines and weather are most often the source of power outages. To reduce the possibility of outages caused from trees we contract with a tree trimming company to prune branches back from electrical lines.

Alternate lighting, heating, and cooking sources are good to have on hand. Some ideas are: flashlights with extra batteries and glow sticks; battery powered lanterns and outdoor solar

lights; outdoor cooking stoves; generators; fireplace; and back up fuel. Candles are not recommended because they can be a fire hazard, and shouldn't be used if any risk of a natural gas leak. If candles are used, never leave them unattended.

I invite you to personally prepare for emergencies. As city government we will respond as quickly as possible in the event of an emergency, although it may take some time depending on the severity of the emergency.

With the volunteer help of Denise Maughan, a very talented citizen of Hyrum, she was able to capture the vision of Hyrum City's identity in an authentic and compelling way. It is bold, clear, and sets the community apart from other cities in the State. Denise designed the logo to represent the feel of the majestic elk and indigenous pine trees that are found throughout our nearby mountains and Hardware Ranch. The green color of the logo is a visual reminder of our stunning views and natural environment that surrounds and engulfs Hyrum City.

The new logo will eventually be seen on all city vehicles, and on new buildings and signs.

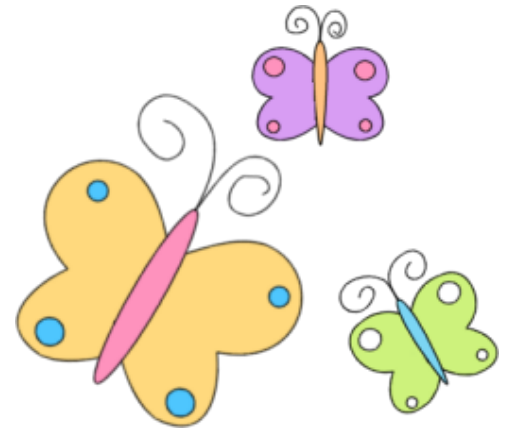
