**Mayors Message** – Did you know that Hyrum's electrical utility is community owned not for profit power utility? Because of this we are able to provide public power at the lowest rates. Public power utilities are owned by the community and governed by our city council.

Hyrum's electricity is generated from coalfired, steam electric, hydroelectric, gas fired, solar and wind facilities. The electricity comes through a transmission line to our four sub-stations. Occasionally, there will be a

disruption in the transmission line which brings the power to the city. There is nothing we can do to control that. Once electricity reaches our sub-stations it is distributed to homes and businesses throughout the community. Birds landing on power lines, fallen tree limbs, severe weather, and failed equipment can disrupt service.

We have a crew of five of the best linemen you can find that respond to power outages in all kinds of weather, day and night, to restore power as quickly as possible. Working with high voltages is dangerous and requires intense training. Our linemen's safety is our first priority. They continue to work on the system to replace aging infrastructure and have been looping the system. That provides a way to get the power back on by bringing it in from another sub-station until they are able to repair the problem.

If your power goes out you can call the city office, 245-6033 or the electrical on-call pager, 881-0563. If no one answers (they are probably working on the problem) please leave a message with your address and phone number in case someone needs to contact you. All messages will be checked to insure that power is restored to all areas. You can find updates on power outages on the Hyrum City Facebook Page.

**Meet Our Hyrum City Lineman** – *Matt Draper*: Matt is Hyrum City's power superintendent. Matt has 29 years of experience in the power industry as a journeyman lineman and power superintendent. Matt worked for Mt. Pleasant for 25 years and has been with Hyrum City for 4 ½ years. Matt has been a UAMPS Board Member for 10 years and is responsible for managing our present and future power as well as our current system upgrades.

Quentin Voth: Quentin was born and raised in Hyrum and was hired by Hyrum City when he was only 16. Quentin now has 16 years of employment with Hyrum City as a journeyman lineman and journeyman meterman. Some of Quentin's responsibilities are: maintaining and caring of the hydro plant; sub-stations and meters. Quinten dislikes power outages more than any citizen of Hyrum.

*Kurtis Johansen*: Kurtis has been employed by Hyrum City for 20 years. Previous to working for Hyrum City he was employed by Mt. Pleasant for 10 years. Some of Kurtis' responsibilities are: line foreman and construct as well as maintain high voltage overhead & underground power systems.

Heath Cullimore: Heath has 13 years of experience. Before working for Hyrum City, Heath worked all over Utah, Colorado, Wyoming and Idaho. Some of Health's responsibilities include: performing everyday line building; maintenance; troubleshooting and training apprentices. Heath cares about Hyrum City and wants the best most reliable power for residents.

Nate Wilcox: Nate is a Cache Valley native, he was raised in Petersboro. Nate is currently 2 years into his 4 year lineman apprenticeship with Hyrum City. Nate attends class once a week in Salt Lake and is required to log 8,000 hours of on the job training. Before coming to Hyrum City, Nate worked for Logan City Street Department, and has a degree in business management.
