Mayors Message – It was another great Star Spangled 4th of July Celebration. Our city council, office staff, city employees and many volunteers are to thank. I am grateful for their service and for the citizens of our community that make Hyrum a great place to live. I feel blessed to live in this great country.

Hyrum City's pressurized irrigation system provides secondary water to over 2,100 homes and properties within the city. The main goal of our Irrigation Department is to utilize the

existing water supply in the best way possible to conserve water and yet provide the citizens of Hyrum with an adequate supply. Hyrum City owns water shares in Porcupine Reservoir, Hyrum Irrigation Company, Porcupine Highline Canal Company, Hyrum Blacksmith Fork Irrigation Company, and other miscellaneous places. Because of our water reuse project we are able to pump around one million gallons of treated waste water daily six months of the year into our pressurized irrigation system to supplement the water held in our ponds. This year we are beginning to expand the ponds so more water can be stored.

City Council Meeting Summary – *A public hearing was held on the following: Adjustments the 2016-17 general and enterprise operating budgets; Adoption of fiscal 2017-18 operating budgets for the General Fund, the Capital Projects Fund, the Culinary Water Fund, the Sewer Fund, the Electric Fund, the Irrigation Water Fund, and the Storm Water Fund; No transfers were proposed from any of the Enterprise Funds to the General Fund for 2017-18; Setting the municipal tax rate for 2017-18 (no increase was proposed); Setting salaries of elected and appointed officials and other municipal employees for 2017-18, and amending Section 2.12.010 of the Hyrum City Municipal Code. *All were approved at City Council Meeting 2 weeks later.*

*Ron Hellstern discussed Hyrum City participating in Loaves and Fishes Program.

*Site plan approval for a metal storage building at 1700 East Anvil Road was given. *Resolution 17-08 was approved setting dog license fees, late fees and impoundment fees. *An ordinance amending Chapter 5.04 Business Licences General of the Hyrum City Municipal Code which addressed food trucks and certain types of Home Occupation Businesses to not be licensed was approved.

*Uncollectable delinquent utility accounts from 2013 were written off.

*An agreement to purchase excess power from Richmond Irrigation Electrical Generation was reached.

The information for this city newsletter is required a month before it is printed. Therefore the July City Council Meeting hasn't taken place at the time this summary is composed.

Emergency Preparedness Tips/Water Storage – One gallon of water per person per day, for drinking and sanitation. Children, nursing mothers, and sick people may need more water. Store water tightly in clean plastic containers such as soft drink bottles in a dark, dry and cool place. Keep at least a three day supply of water per person with a goal of building to a two week supply or more. Rotate water every 6 months.

National Night Out Against Crime – Hyrum will be hosting the annual National Night Out Against Crime on Tuesday, August 1st at 6:30 p.m. on the City Square in conjunction with many communities across Utah and the United States. National Night Out, a yearlong community building campaign, is designed to: 1) heighten crime prevention awareness, 2) generate support for, and participation in, local anticrime programs, 3) strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships, and 4) send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.



Hyrum will be providing free hamburgers as well as hosting various law enforcement groups as well as other community service providers. These groups will have information available as well as demonstrations. The Life Flight helicopter will also be landing at the baseball field just behind the city office building.
