**City Council Meeting Summary –** \*Final plat approval for South Cache Subdivision Phase 4, located at 100 South 500 West, consisting of 18 single family building lots was given.

\*Utah Local Governments Trust presented Hyrum City with its Trust Accountability Program Award. To receive the award city employees must participate in the required safety training. The city receives a rebate each year for meeting those requirements.

\*Blake Foster was appointed by the City Council to serve on the Planning Commission.

\*Resolution 17-10 which accepts the Municipal Wastewater Planning Program and reviewing the Self-Assessment Report for 2016 was approved.

\*Resolution 17-11 declaring the Senior Center 1994 Dodge Ram Van and 2008 Ford Starcraft Bus as surplus allowing them to be sold was approved.

\*Resolution 17-12 setting Feed-In-Tariff Fee Schedule at  $4\alpha$  per kwh was approved.

\*Ordinance 17-11 to amend the requirements and conditions that allow an electric utility customer to install, maintain and generate solar power and for Hyrum City to purchase the solar power was approved. \*Ordinance 17-12 annexing properties north of Hwy 101 and east of 800 East which include: Kilgore, Jack B. Parson, Craig Thornley and Hyrum City properties was approved.

\*Solar Power Generation Purchase Agreement form was approved.

\*Approval of an offer to purchase Hyrum City's parcel on the corner of 100 East Main Street was approved.
