City Council Meeting Summary – Site plan approval was given for a log furniture manufacturer located at 1700 East Anvil Road. The final plat for Green Meadow Villas located at 291 West Main was approved.

Resolution 16-09 was passed setting dog impoundment fees. Impoundment fees remain at \$15 per day for first time impoundment but increase to \$25 per day if previously impounded in the previous 24 months.

Resolution 16-10 was passed increasing commercial and industrial water rates above 50,000 gallons from .60 per 1000 gallons to .80. We have the 2nd lowest commercial rates in the valley.

The council approved the appointment of Kevin Anderson from an alternate to a regular member of the planning commission board.

The council also approved the appointment of Marci Bingham to the Hyrum Library Board.

Spring Cleanup – Dumpsters will be available for your use at East Park (700 East Main) April 22nd – 30th. Remember please DO NOT discard these items in the dumpsters: tires, automotive batteries, motor oil, antifreeze, chemicals, ashes, fireworks, and paint.

Metal recycling bins will be available for any metal (aluminum, steel, etc.). Please remember that refrigerators will be accepted only if Freon is drained.

Junk cars will also be accepted during our spring cleanup. You must provide Hyrum City the title to the vehicle. If you have any questions or need assistance please call the City Office at 245-6033.
