Ordinance 16-01 was approved which made minor changes to Title 6 of the Hyrum City Municipal Code (animals).



**Bear River Health Departments "Walking Works" Challenge –** During the month of May Mayors from cities and towns across northern Utah are encouraging communities to walk. Join the Walking Works Challenge; it is as easy as one, two, three:

- 2. Connect any wearable device or phone app to track your steps.

Let's see how far our community can walk during the month of May.



On May 20<sup>th</sup> join us for a few steps at the Logan Mayor's 1-Mile Walk, beginning at noon at the west entrance of the Logan City Library. No registration is required for this event, however the first 200 participants to arrive will receive a reflective armband.

**Burn Permits -** If you have clippings, bushes, plants and pruning's from trees you would like to burn, please remember you must first obtain a burn permit. Every day the clearing is checked with the Utah Division of Air Quality to determine if burning will be allowed.

Permits may be issued between March 30<sup>th</sup> and May 30<sup>th</sup> and between September 15<sup>th</sup> and October 30<sup>th</sup>.

Additional information and the burn permit application can be completed online at <u>www.cachecounty.org</u> by clicking the flame image in the I Want to section or by calling 800-458-0145. If your fire extends beyond your control you should immediately call the fire department at 911.

**Pressurized Irrigation –** The irrigation companies are busy cleaning the garbage and debris out of the ditches to provide us with irrigation water as soon as possible. Look for the irrigation water to arrive between the 1<sup>st</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> of May.

**4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade –** We are just a few months away from this year's parade and 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration. This year we are making a few changes to the parade. <u>Horse Entries</u>: Must provide a 'pooper scooper' if your entry includes horses. <u>Bands</u>: We want more bands. If you know of others who are interested in participating, please have them apply. <u>Business Entries</u>: in past years we have seen an increase in the number of businesses participating – which is great. We do encourage you put together an entry vs. just 'driving a company vehicle down the road.' Make it fun! If you still want to drive down the road in a company vehicle, we are requesting a \$25 donation to either the Hyrum City Library or the Elite Hall Restoration Fund.
