City Council Meeting Summary – A business license was approved for Annette Staffanson at 770 West 250 North for a Preschool and Kindergarten Extension.

Kilgore's Annexation, also known as LeGrand Johnson Construction was approved.

A resolution declaring city property surplus at 100 East Main was approved. The property will be listed with a realtor to be sold.

Certification of annexation petition was approved for the Kendrick and Knight properties.

Bids for the 2016 Hyrum road projects were considered and awarded.

Electric Meters – Our electric department is in the process of changing all electric meters over to our new electric metering system. Please make sure that your meter is accessible uncovered and free from trees, bushes, etc. This allows our electricians easy access to your meter. Thanks for your help.

4th of July Celebration – The Hyrum City Council and staff has decided to make some changes to our 4th of July Celebrations in the future. Property along the parade route can only be marked off and saved <u>the day of the parade beginning at 5:00 a.m.</u> Anything marked before that time will be removed. Over the years we have experienced damage to property as well as problems mowing and watering to prepare for our celebration. Please help us inform others from our surrounding communities of this upcoming change.

We appreciate the help of the Cache County Sherrif's Office during our celebration. The city council as well as the sheriff's office continue to make safety our highest priority especially during our parade. Unsafe or reckless operations of vehicles will not be tolerated. Entries that plan to distribute candy and/or other giveaways during the parade MUST assign someone to walk the parade route in order to safely distribute items to spectators. Participants are not allowed to hang off the sides of vehicles during the parade, and all vehicles must remain in the travel lane of the parade.

Parades are a wonderful way to bring communities together. We want to make our city celebration as safe and fun as possible for everyone.

School Zones – School is back in session, please make sure to observe all crosswalks and school zones. Any violation now requires a mandatory court appearance. Our crossing guards do a great job protecting our children. Statute 40-6a-1002(2) states – The operator of a vehicle approaching a school crosswalk shall come to a complete stop at the school crosswalk if: (a) a school speed limit sign has the warning lights operating and (b) the crosswalk is occupied by a person. (Curb to Curb.) Please be patient and slow down when approaching school crosswalks.

Water Heating – (Information provided by APPA/The American Public Power Association) Did you know water heating probably accounts for 10 to 15% of your total energy use? This is partly due to the equipment itself, and partly due to your water-use habits. If your water heater is old, consider replacing it before it gives out. Ask about energy efficiency, as many home centers and plumbing companies sell what they have in stock and will not explain the difference in operating costs unless you ask them.

An energy label estimates operating costs based on national average gas and electricity rates. It is useful in comparing water heaters of the same basic design.
