Mayors Message – As summer comes to an end I would like to recognize and thank our parks and recreation staff for the wonderful job they have done in helping improve and maintain our parks. Hyrum owns and maintains 13 parks: A.J.'s Park, Blacksmith Park, Camp Hollow, Canyon Campground, Canyon Lodge, Canyon Park, CCC Camp, City Square, East Park, Left Hand Fork Property, Pride Park, Salt Hollow Park and the Soccer Complex. The Uniform National Land Standard suggests 10 acres of recreational property per 1,000 people. Hyrum is well past that standard, with 29 acres

per 1,000 people and a total of more than 173 acres of recreational property available to the public.

There are several dates citizens might want to be aware of: the pressurized irrigation shut off date is scheduled for October 1st, also burn permits will be issued September 15th – October 30th as weather allows. You may apply for a burn permit through a link on the city's website www.hyrumcity.com.

City Council Meeting Summary – A public hearing was held to receive public comment on amending Chapter 13.18, the Storm Water Ordinance of Title 13 of the Hyrum City Municipal Code to further comply with the State of Utah and the United States Environmental Protection Agency. As a result Ordinance 16-05 was approved.

A public hearing was held to receive public comment regarding a petition filed by Craig Thornley and Scott Kendrick proposing the annexation of 1.56 acres of real property, located between approximately 825 East and 850 East between Highway 101 and 110 North.

Concept Plan was approved for Auburn Hills Subdivision located at approximately 600 South 800 East which consists of 121 residential single family houses on 44.23 acres.

Site Plan approval was given to Homestead Cabinets for a storage building at 200 North 100 East.

Ordinance 16-06 was approved, imposing a temporary moratorium on development of storage units while the Planning Commission reviews and determines if changes to the Municipal Code should be considered by the City Council. The Planning Commission will hold a public hearing when they consider their final recommendations.

Hyrum City Council reviewed the Moderate Income Housing Plan before it was returned to the State of Utah.

A real estate company was selected to be the agent for the sale of the city property at 100 East Main. It will be sold as residential or commercial building lots.

Resolution 16-28 was approved declaring Hyrum City real property as surplus and ordering the sale of disposal therof.

The information for this city newsletter is required a month before it is printed. Therefore the October council meeting hasn't taken place at the time this summary is composed.

Blacksmith Fork Canyon Trail – The Blacksmith Fork Canyon Trail is now open. The Conservation Corp. sent trail builders and equipment out to the site in September, and along with volunteers, the trail was further groomed and now has officially opened. We have also received a \$15,693 grant from the Federal Highway Administration & Utah State Parks to further develop the trail. The trail begins by the first bridge at the mouth of Blacksmith Fork Canyon and ends 1.7 miles up the canyon at the second bridge. This trail follows the river as it comes out of the canyon. Parts of the trail are in the trees and other parts rise above the river and follow a course on the side of the mountain. This trail will eventually continue further up the canyon as easements allow. Parking is available in the Division of Wildlife Property on the north side of the road. This is a non-motorized trail. This trailhead also connects to the Bonneville Shore Trail that follows along the game fence and extends to Providence Canyon. This new trial and trailhead connections will provide added recreational opportunities.

We thank the Conservation Corp., volunteers, Dayton Crities (Cache County Trails Planner), State & Federal Agencies (provided grants & easements), Green Canyon LLC (easement), and Hyrum City Employees for their work in helping to bring this project together.
