Winter Parking Restrictions – Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal rightof-way between the hours on 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Dog Licenses – Any dog(s) six (6) months or older is required to be licensed with Hyrum City. Dogs are required to be licensed even if they stay inside your home or never leave your yard. The license fees are as follows:

Neutered/Spayed dogs - \$8 Male dogs - \$12 Female dogs - \$15 A veterinarian certificate is required to verify rabies vaccination and the dog being neutered or spayed. <u>All dogs must be licensed by Friday, February 27th</u>. After February 27th a \$10 late fee will be assessed in addition to the regular license fee. Owners will be issued a citation for failure to have his/her dog properly licensed. Also, please remember that City Ordinance permits a maximum of **two dogs per household**.
