Mayors Message – Due to numerous calls, Hyrum City would like to inform all residents on door to door solicitation laws in Hyrum.

Hyrum City <u>does</u> allow solicitors to come to residential homes, if they have a permit from Hyrum City. If a solicitor comes to your door you will know they have obtained a permit from Hyrum City to do so, if they are wearing a clip on photo identification badge with Hyrum City's name and logo on it. Hyrum City requires a background check on all solicitors

before a license is issued, also they are required to wear the identification badge at all times. If a solicitor comes to your home and is not wearing a Hyrum City Solicitor Badge, please contact the Cache County Sheriff's Office at 753-7555.

Those exempt from this law are persons who have been invited to a residence, persons disseminating information for, against, or in conjunction with any religious belief, or political position, or persons representing a charitable organization.



Burn Permits – Open burn permits will be available beginning March 30th until May 30th. To obtain a permit visit www.airquality.utah.gov (under quick links, click open burn permit application) or call 800-458-0145.

Pressurized Irrigation – The irrigation companies are busy cleaning the garbage and debris out of the ditches and canals to provide us with irrigation water. Look for irrigation water to arrive between the 1st and 15th of May.

Stormwater – Squash a litterbug! Keep the lid closed on dumpsters and recycling bins to prevent unintentional litter from hitting the streets. Schedule a parking lot/neighborhood litter clean-up, especially in the early spring and late fall. To encourage cigarette butts from being thrown out car windows or dropped on the ground, which is littering, plain and simple, provide staff and customers with a clearly marked receptacle.
