Message from the Sewer Department – As I drive through town I see sewer lateral clean outs sticking out of the lawns and ground. A few years ago the city enacted a code where new construction is required to put a trace wire along the buried pipe work and up to the surface outside the house. The clean out is to be housed in an 11" by 17" sprinkler box for easy access. This will allow for the trace wire to be hooked to a locater to be able to tell direction and depth. More importantly it allows for fast easy access to pipe for cleaning and or unplugging of the pipe. Most sewer plugs, happen in the house or the line from house to the city mains in the street. The home owner is responsible for maintaining and plugs in this area. The other cleanouts can be cut down to ground level. (For cleaning purposes it would be helpful to have them accessible) There is nothing I know of more inviting to children than to drop rocks into a vertical pipe in the ground, thereby plugging it. Please keep cleanouts, especially the closest to the house accessible for cleanina.
