Interested In Serving On The City Council - Notice is hereby given that Hyrum City will hold a Municipal Election this fall to elect three candidates to serve four year terms on the Hyrum City Council. Persons desiring to be candidates for the 2015 Hyrum City Municipal Election must file a declaration of candidacy form or nomination petition between June 1, 2015 and June 8, 2015 at the City Recorder's Office, 83 West Main, Hyrum, Utah weekdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Candidates must meet the following qualifications: 1. Be a United States citizen; 2. Be a registered voter of the City; 3. Be a resident of Hyrum City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election; and 4. Not be a convicted felon, unless their right to hold elective office has been restored.

The primary election, if necessary, will be held Tuesday, August 11, 2015 and the municipal election will be held Tuesday, November 3, 2015.


We are so excited to have our grant projects 100% done. Thanks for your patience with all the construction, we got a lot accomplished.
