**Mayors Message** – Summer in Cache Valley has been a warm one this year. Many of you have cooled off at our splash pad at Salt Hollow Park, which water is re-cycled into our irrigation system. You may have spent time at Hyrum Reservoir boating, canoeing, swimming, or fishing. Our canyon properties are a wonderful place to escape the heat while picnicking and playing at the park, or camping in one of our three campgrounds. However you are spending your summer, I hope you are enjoying it!

Hyrum City's pressurized irrigation system provides secondary water to over 2,100 homes and properties within the city. The main goal of the irrigation department is to utilize the existing water supply in the best way possible to conserve water and yet provide the citizens of Hyrum with adequate supply. The irrigation ponds are filled from water shares the City owns in several irrigation and canal companies. One million gallons of reclaimed water from our waste water treatment facility is put into the system daily. Because of the water shortage this year we are occasionally running two wells to supplement water to the system. The council has placed some restrictions on watering. There will be **no watering on Mondays from 6:00 a.m. until Tuesdays at 6:00 a.m.**, to conserve water and allow the irrigation ponds to fill. Failure to comply with the water restrictions will result in a warning first, second time a ticket, third time a ticket and loss of water privileges. At age 18, Lloyd enlisted in the Military for two years serving in California, and Oklahoma, and was trained in firing artillery. Following his discharge he lived a short time in California where he met and married Judy. They both agreed that there was no better place to raise children than in Hyrum, Utah. So, shortly after returning to Hyrum, Lloyd purchased and operated a barber shop located here on Main Street in the 1960's. After operating that barber shop for six years, Lloyd sold it and set up a new shop located on the back of his home. During this same time he went to work full time at E.A. Millers while continuing his barbering at his Hyrum home which he continues to do even today. Lloyd worked 34 years at the beef packing plant training and positively influencing thousands of people regarding priorities in life and the development of a sound work ethic. Lloyd has given over 20,000 haircuts in the City of Hyrum, many to lifelong friends. He enjoys providing a service and the social aspects of cutting hair. Imagine the political and social problems solved over the past 55 years in Lloyd's Barber Shop. Lloyd's love has always

been the outdoors and our local mountains. As a young man he traveled the trails on horses he trained and raised. He has since traded horses in for his ATV. He always enjoys riding with family and friends. Lloyd has emulated and instilled in his children the values of hard work, education, relationships, and service to others. He continues to practice these values himself in caring for Judy who suffered a stroke 18 months ago. Lloyd has three children and nine grandchildren. Lloyd has always been connected to people... he is personable, and well respected by all that know him. His family and friends, love and respect him for the lifetime example of service to God, family, country and community.
