Arbor Day Celebration – Saturday, September 26th 9:00 a.m. – Volunteer Pruning Project: Come help us whip some trees and shrubs into shape. No experience or tools necessary – there will be plenty of work for anyone who wants to help.

1:00 p.m. – Hyrum Community Bare-Root Tree Sale: Hyrum City is organizing a community tree purchase that will allow citizens to buy young, bare-root trees at wholesale prices. Dozens of species of trees, shrubs, and vines will be available at prices that come to as little as \$1.50 each and for the most expensive options, not much more than \$10 each*. Our arborist will hold an info session at the Elite Hall at 1:00 p.m. All orders will be finalized later this fall and received Spring 2016.

*The offerings are only sold in bundles and individual trees will be priced in relation to how many trees of each given species are desired.



School Zones – Now that school is back in session, please make sure to observe all crosswalks and school zones. Any violation now requires a mandatory court appearance. Our crossing guards do a great job protecting our children. Statute 40-6a-1002(2) states – The operator of a vehicle approaching a school crosswalk shall come to a complete stop at the school crosswalk if: (a) a school speed limit sign has the warning lights operating and (b) the crosswalk is occupied by a person. (Curb to Curb.) Please be patient and slow down when approaching school crosswalks.
