November City Council Meeting Summary – Sheriff Chad Jensen, Cache County Sheriff discussed Hyrum City's law enforcement contract. The City Council is pleased with the service Hyrum City is receiving.

Jeff Daniels, Central Milling was approved for site plan approval for a flour mill at 168 South 1720 East. Construction will begin soon for this grain sprouting facility to be built at our Blacksmith Fork Industrial Park.

The Council also approved a trade and loan of fire equipment with other fire departments in Cache County. Our fire department will be trading an older engine for a newer one that will help with fighting wild fires.

The City Council is also considering increasing dog license fees. Hyrum City has two part time animal control officers who provide us with as good of coverage as any other city in our area. The 2016 estimated budget for our Animal Control department is \$33,480. Revenues received from licenses and fees are just under \$10,000. It is felt that dog owners should carry a larger share of the animal control costs. Currently, Hyrum has the lowest rates in the valley. The Council will further review the rates at Decembers City Council Meeting. **Winter Parking Restrictions –** Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect between November 1st and April 1st, even when there is no snow.
