Mayors Message - The kids are back in school!! We have a new traffic light at the intersection of 800 East & 300 South by Mountain Crest which will make traffic flow better and improve safety for pedestrians as well as vehicles. Hyrum City hires crossing guards for the elementary schools. Debbie Jewkes is the crossing guard at Lincoln Elementary. Shalyn Maxfield & Heidi Pearce are crossing guards at Canyon Elementary. As you plan your child's safe route to school, we hope you will encourage them to cross safely

where a crossing guard can assist them. Their safety is very important!

As drivers we need to be aware and alert in school zones. A reminder that the speed limit in a school zone is 20 miles per hour. In a school zone, a vehicle must come to a complete stop if a pedestrian is in the crosswalk. If a vehicle is stopped for a pedestrian, another vehicle my not pass the stopped vehicle but must also stop. A vehicle must yield to a pedestrian in a marked or unmarked crosswalk or intersection if that pedestrian is in the roadway. A vehicle crossing a sidewalk (such as a driveway or parking lot entrance crosses a sidewalk) must yield to a pedestrian on the sidewalk. If a school bus, has it's flashing lights on, it is illegal to pass it. Allow yourself extra time to get where you are going. I wish all children, school teachers, and staff a great school year!

Museum News – Did you know that there's a Smithsonian exhibition in Hyrum right now?!? Visit the museum to see "H2O Today" to explore the beauty and essential nature of water in Utah through immersive content, interactives, and digital media. Twenty years ago, Hyrum hosted another Smithsonian exhibition entitled "Yesterday's Tomorrows" at the Elite Hall, which featured wedding dresses from the 1940's and '50s salvaged from Maud's by Linda Christiansen just days before the building was demolished. Some of the dresses were auctioned off to benefit fundraising for the museum/library building. However, many are still housed in the museum's collections, along with artifacts from Maud's, to ensure that they are protected and preserved for decades to come. The museum is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Wednesdays and the 2nd Saturday of each month from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and by appointment.

There are SO MANY wonderful events happening throughout the Bear River Heritage Area right now as part of "H2O Today" exhibition!
