Mayors Message – We are essentially complete with the sewer plant rebuild. Even with the delays and supply problems we were able to stay on budget. The rebuild included doubling the water basins, giving us the ability to handle growth in the future.

You will soon notice the paint on the Elite Hall being removed to restore the original brick. Because the brick is soft the paint must be removed chemically to

avoid damage to the brick. We can do this due to several years of RAPZ tax money that we received along with money budgeted from the city.

Building of the new skate and BMX bike track at Blacksmith Fork Park will soon be underway. It is estimated to take approximately four months to be completed and ready for use in late summer. The plans are to finish the entire near 30-acre park this summer. The park will include use of new ball diamonds, an amphitheater, playground, additional restrooms, additional pickleball courts, and pavilions.

Logan City gave notice to Cache County that they will not be collecting garbage in the county but will only be serving Logan residents after December 2023. The county, along with Mayors throughout the valley are looking into alternative sources to provide this service for our county and will have everything ready by that date. More details will be given as things progress.

**Spring Clean-Up -** Dumpsters will be available for your use at East Park (700 East Main) April 27<sup>th</sup> – May 5<sup>th</sup> 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. Remember please **DO NOT** discard these items in the dumpsters: tires, automotive batteries, motor oil, antifreeze, chemicals, ashes, fireworks, and paint. Metal recycling bins will be available for any metal (aluminum, steel, etc.). Please remember that refrigerators will be accepted only if Freon is drained.



**Irrigation Reminders** – Just a few reminders for the upcoming 2022 irrigation season. Please keep in mind that with the drought and supply shortages in our current economy it may be very difficult to have a full water season without conflict in supply & maintenance. Keep the following in mind while using the irrigation system:

- Hyrum City is responsible for the service line to the shut off valve. Responsibility of anything past the city installed shutoff valve falls upon the property owner.
- Please keep shutoff valves accessible and clean in case of need of an emergency shut-off.
- Some services installed after April 2021 have a meter structure beyond the primary shut-off valve. In this situation, Hyrum City is responsible to the meter structure. Anything past the structure is the homeowner's responsibility.
- Please remember that the irrigation water is not filtered. If you choose to filter the water, we recommend you use as course of a filter as possible. In time of drought and low stream flows Hyrum City will cut back on flushing main lines to conserve water.
- Hyrum City's irrigation system relies primarily on streamflow. With low snowpack, streamflow's are down, so we ask everyone to conserve as much as possible.
- Hyrum City has two irrigation systems: one gravity system and one pressurized system ran on pumping stations. This means at certain times based off supply, demand, or maintenance, some areas may temporarily have lower pressure or be without water.
- Be considerate of the supply chain shortages as well as the drought & water shortages. Please be patient on repair times with water outages. Supplies & parts have been very hard to come by lately and can take a substantial amount of time to be available for installation.

**Museum News –** Did you know that war is saturated with objects shaped and carried from battlefields to homes? While sometimes these objects end up in museums, the personal stories that accompany them often do not. Do you have anything at your house that was brought home from a war? Do you know the stories tied to that object? For our Second Saturday event on April 9<sup>th</sup>, we are thrilled to partner with the Mountain West Center at USU to host "Bringing War Home" from 2:00 - 4:00 p.m. Experts will be at the museum to give veterans, members of military families, and the general public basic tools to help better understand things brought home from war. Elite Hall Restoration Committee - We are thrilled to let the community know that rehabilitation work on the exterior masonry of Elite Hall will be starting next month! Due to the hard work of several city officials, employees, and a dedicated group of volunteers combined with generous support from many community members, the Cache County RAPZ fund, the Utah State Historic Preservation Office, and the Hyrum Heritage Foundation, Hyrum City is ready to start restoring the Elite Hall's historical integrity while making it more functional, accessible, and efficient for our community! Over the next few months, you will see the front vestibule removed. It is not original to the building, not a compatible architectural style, and a seismic problem. Don't worry, the beautiful blue neon signage is being preserved to be re-installed at a later date. Then, all of the grey paint will be removed from the exterior masonry, and you will be able to see the beautiful blend of colors the masons selected over 100 years ago! Historic masonry experts will repair the mortar and replace damaged bricks and then apply a breathable water-repelling protectant. We have architectural plans drawn and ready to build an annex on the east side of Elite Hall, which will provide areater accessibility and usability for the building. We also have plans to restore the Club Room and update the kitchen and restrooms. These, as well as others, are all available as tax deductible "named" funding projects, so if you're interested in sponsoring a specific aspect of the restoration work and would like your name attached, please contact Jami at the museum.
