**Mayors Message** – The city's fiscal year ends June 30<sup>th</sup> with the new fiscal year beginning July 1<sup>st</sup>. The budget for the 2022-2023 year has been recently approved. I would like to share our estimates of what we are planning for the new fiscal year.

When property taxes are paid the school district receives 71%, Cache County 19%, Hyrum City 9% and Mosquito Abatement 1%. Based on 2022-2023 estimates, the city provides \$1,856.04 of General Fund Services to each home (not including solid waste collection or utility services). An average of \$176.66 of property tax collected (based on 3,500 homes) leaves \$1,679.38 of those services provided to come from sources other than property tax. Money collected from sales tax, licenses & permits, impact fees and facility rentals help to fill that gap. A tax increase is not planned with the new budget.

The largest expenditures included in this year's budget are road rebuild & slurry seal, including 900 West Road rebuild; 300 South Sidewalk and Elite Hall restoration. Maintenance of the water distribution system has steadily increased as infrastructure ages and the system expands with addition development projects. Recent upgrades I the sewer plant should keep the plant running efficiently. Demand for electricity continues to increase as well as the cost to purchase power. An additional substation is being built in the northwest part of Hyrum to meet those needs and relieve some of the demand from other substations. State law is requiring secondary water connections to be metered. This project will take some time and will be a big expense. Storm water is becoming more & more of a concern as well as more work required by employees to stay in compliance.

Today we manage a community of nearly 10,000 people and provide the quality of service expected with the least impact to finances. Because of past budgeting and future planning, Hyrum City remains in good financial condition despite the unsettled economy.

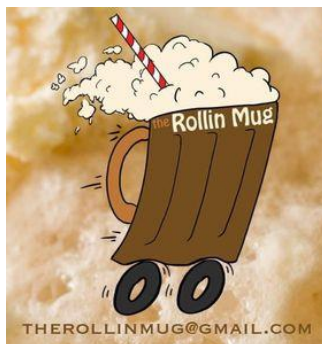
