Dog Licenses – Any dog(s) four (4) months or older is required to be licensed with Hyrum City. Dogs are required to be licensed even if they stay inside your home or never leave your yard. The license fees are as follows:

Neutered/Spayed dogs - \$12

Male/Female dogs - \$22

A veterinarian certificate is required to verify rabies vaccination and the dog being neutered or spayed. All dogs must be licensed by Tuesday, February 28th. After February 28th a \$5 late fee will be assessed in addition to the regular license fee. Owners will be issued a citation for failure to have their dog(s) properly licensed. Also, please remember that Hyrum City Ordinance permits a maximum of **two dogs per household**.

NEW Winter Parking Restrictions - Parking is not allowed on city streets or within ten feet of roadway pavement in any municipal right-of-way, unless such vehicle is in a driveway approach or otherwise parked behind the curb where curb exists for a period longer than fifteen minutes when loading or unloading or delivering property between the hours of <u>12:00</u> midnight to 8:00 a.m. and when a snowstorm is predicted no parking after 11:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. This law allows for snow removal and is in effect until April 1st, even when there is no snow.

Indoor Walking - The Elite Hall is open for free public walking every Monday—Friday from 7:00—10:00 a.m. All are welcome, but please supervise children and don't bring any food or drinks other than water. The Elite Hall will be closed to walkers on February 9th & 10th.

Museum News - Did you know that Nathan Bankhead, an enslaved black man who arrived in the Salt Lake Valley in 1848 with the Heber C. Kimball Company was one of Cache Valley's first pioneers? Nathan became patriarch of one of Utah's large black pioneer families, moving from the Cottonwood area, to Perry, to Wellsville in 1859. Nathan and his wife, Susan, left Cache Valley in 1862 when President Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation, but many of their children remained in Wellsville including George, who had learned the Ute language and became an interpreter.

Utah has a rich black heritage that few people know about and to celebrate Black History Month, we are pleased to partner with Utah's Sema Hadithi African American Heritage and Culture Foundation to host programming and an exhibit throughout February and March. Join us for the grand opening of "Utah's Black Veterans" for our SUPER SATURDAY event on February 11th. Sema Hadithi Executive Director Robert Burch will join us at 11:00 a.m. for a presentation on Utah's Black History and the museum will be open from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

We will also learn about a black mountain man named James Beckwourth and his adventures trapping and trading beaver pelts during our Back in Time Children's Activity "Adventures Beckwourth-y of James" on February 14th —16th from 1:00—1:30 p.m. each day.

Our FREE Family Movie this month will be Cool Runnings on the big screen at the Elite Hall on Friday, February 3rd. Doors open at 6:30 p.m. and the movie will begin at 7:00 p.m. Wear your comfy clothes, bring your pillows, blankets, bean bags, camp chairs, etc. and your own dinner and/or treats. This is a free public event, and everyone is welcome, so don't forget to invite your friends!

The museum is honored to partner with the Utah Cold War Veterans Foundation to recognize all local veterans of the Cold War.
