Mayors Message – "The purpose of human life is to serve, and to show compassion and the will to help others." – Albert Schweitzer. I'm grateful to live where people help each other and give service in the community! We've been through some challenging times: covid, severe winds, record snow, and flooding. In each of these I've witnessed the compassion and help you've offered to one another.

We are currently going through the budget process. Our revenues are ahead of projections. Estimates for 2023 – 2024 show that \$2,055.95 of general fund services are given to each home (this does not include solid waste collection or utility services). The city receives an estimate of \$169.82 from property taxes

collected per home. That means \$1,886.13 comes from other sources other than property tax. Sales tax from online sales and existing businesses have helped considerably.

Some of our plans this year are to finish up the landscaping at the Blacksmith Fork Park and have a ribbon cutting for the skate park. Our fire department has been given \$350,000 from JBS and \$200,000 from the county fire department, along with funds saved by the city for the purpose of purchasing a ladder truck. We will begin development of the West Park this summer, located in Mount Sterling Farms development. Enjoy summer and be safe!

Election Notice – Notice is hereby given that Hyrum City will hold a Municipal Election this fall to elect three candidates to serve four-year terms on the Hyrum City Council.

Candidates must meet the following qualifications: 1. Be a United States citizen; 2. Be a registered voter of the City; 3. Be a resident of Hyrum City for at least 365 consecutive days immediately preceding the date of the election; and 4. Not be a convicted felon, unless their right to hold elective office has been restored.

Persons desiring to be candidates for the 2023 Hyrum City Municipal Election must file a declaration of candidacy form or nomination petition between June 1, 2023, thru June 7, 2023 at the City Recorder's Office, 60 West Main, Hyrum, Utah weekdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Hyrum City requires individuals filing as candidates for the Hyrum City Council to pay a \$25 fee at the time of filing.

The primary election, if necessary, will be held Tuesday, August 15, 2023, and the municipal election will be held Tuesday, November 7, 2023.


