Museum News - Did you know that our country's current 50-star flag has flown for over 60 years, since July 4, 1960? Prior to that, the longest-flying flag---for 47 years, from July 4, 1912 until July 3, 1959---was the 48- star flag. The number of stars on the American flag first grew to 48 in 1912 with the addition of New Mexico and Arizona and it flew during the presidencies of William H. Taft, Woodrow Wilson, Warren Harding, Calvin Coolidge, Herbert Hoover, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry S Truman, and Dwight D. Eisenhower. During this time, the United States emerged from the Great Depression and World War II as one of the leading nations in the world. It is the flag that soldiers and sailors fought for during World War II and the Korean War. It is the flag to which children, mothers, and wives pledged their allegiance at home while their loved ones left to serve overseas. And, it is the flag that draped the caskets of servicemembers who perished during this time period. Join us at the Elite Hall on Tuesday, July 4th between 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. for our Grand Old Flag display, see over 50 historic US Flags and learn more about their histories.

It's not too late for your family to visit the museum to get your Passport to Summer Fun! There are a lot of fun things to do, including drop-in activities during our summer-long 2023 children's program. If you go to Hyrum's parade on July 4th, be sure to visit the Elite Hall for our Grand Old Flag display between 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. We will have a patriotic art activity, plus kids can receive a special stamp in their passports. We will also host Playing on Prairie on Tuesday, July 25th from 1:00

-3:00 p.m. Kids will learn more about life for children in the late 1800s through activities and an art project. Everyone who earns at least nine stamps in their passport will be invited to our summer-end pizza party on August 3rd. The museum is open Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and by appointment.
